- A. Park & Rec Program Pictures:** Butt asked for guidance for a solution for pictures for our Park & Rec programs. We had some issues last year and would like some guidance from Park Board. Moe stated that we have so many photographers now that we could open for bid. Others conversed about putting a policy in place and bringing it to the board to make changes. We need more consistency with it and want to help everyone and go from there.

A motion was made by Gregg and seconded by Breken to have Butt put a policy in place.

- B. Pool Update:** The pool boiler overflow float was not working and was filling into the wrong pipes. The switch to fix that was \$3,300. Fit & Fin donated that money for the repair. They used the Lemonade Stand money that they received to make that work. The part is ordered and should be in tomorrow. The board and Butt thanked Fin & Fit for donating that money. Butt also stated that we are purchasing a floating volleyball net/court system. We are hoping to get a league going there at the pool. Having another adult league would be great with more people using the pool.

- C. Budget:** Our revenues this year have been good. Adult rec is low and we don't have a lot. Women's Sand Volleyball, Coed Turf Volleyball, Women's Volleyball, & Men's Softball. We will look at adding Water Volleyball. We do have curling, but that is ran with UMC. Morgan suggested renting out skates and Scott will look into it. Butt stated we can look into charging for open skating and open hockey like we do for the pool. Private lessons are down due to no staff being able to teach them. We are working on getting more staff hired. The camping fees will increase after we are done with Express use during harvest season.
