

Highway 2 Crookston Downtown Sidewalk Replacement Project

About the project The Minnesota Department of Transportation will be installing improvements to Hwy 2 from the Red Lake River Bridge, including Roberts St, Broadway, Main Street, and 6th St to the railroad underpass in Crookston. This project will also include the City-led project of two blocks of Main and Broadway, south of Roberts St.

This project has been developed over years of collaborative planning between the City of Crookston and MnDOT. It has included a Joint Powers Agreement to fund the corridor study, and a rigorous community-supported alternatives analysis process, leading to the final design.

Project Elements

- Lane Reduction – 3 lanes to 2 lanes section
- Curb Bump-outs at the intersections
- New wider Sidewalks, wider boulevards and ADA compliance upgrades
- Bicycle Facilities
- Streetscaping and Aesthetics
- New Signals at Main/Roberts & Broadway/Roberts





Figure 1: Shows Broadway Avenue facing north towards Robert Street
